

I paint the images that for some reason pops up in my head, or I deliberately provoke inspired by something I have heard, seen or experienced.

Once an idea for a painting has manifested itself in my head, it stays until it has been painted on to the canvas. I know the painting is finished when the idea has left my mind.

Recently I have made a series of deer based on an idea of making my own personal interpretation of the traditional paintings of "the roaring stag". I tried to create a beautiful world in a grotesque universe by adding some edge to the traditional motif through contrasts containing humor, irony, seriousness, nature and imagination.

I hope the audience will view my paintings with contemplation, but also with a smile.

As an extension of my deer-paintings, I continued in the animal kingdom and painted goats and moose. This time I chose to make the "ugliness" such as garbage beautiful by neutralizing the colors, but still keep it in focus by making the texture lifelike.

I constantly seek to challenge myself by trying out new paint styles and experimenting with the reproduction of texture such as glass, metal and plastic.

I am by no means done painting animals, however at the moment I mostly feel like painting people - people with a certain charisma that inspires me.

The combination of being an engineer and long training in art theory and a more practical artistic expression, should maybe have given pictures based on structure, skill and knowledge. The reality is that this often only is a part of the picture, and that the picture evolves in a borderland. A borderland between on one hand emotion and intuition and on the other knowledge and intellect.

In the later years Petter pictures has moved from the totally abstract and pretty dark and gloomy, through abstract expressionism with figurative elements to pictures that combines the figurative with the abstract.

Might it be the intuition that is inspired by glances, both in the city and in the nature, that is expressed in the figurative elements in an otherwise abstract "landscape".








Arvid Ehn

The starting point to the painting is always a feeling. It can be an idea that gives the need to paint, it can also be unwillingness that creates a picture.

Improvisation is an important part of the creation, but at the same time well thought through ideas probably is half. Both originate from the subconscious. I try to create a struggle between the watchers fantasy and subconscious, that's the idea behind the improvisation and the more thought through idea.

The goal is to let the beholder form his own meaning and reason for the painting.

What the artist meant by painting the picture is secondary, the most fulfilling works of art are probably always the ones that the beholder makes up his own stories about.

Now Eva is an international well considered artist.








Michael Sasserson

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Expressing thoughts on Michael Sasserson and his universe of Gods, it can be very difficult finding the precise words which hit you in the heart as his personality and his way of expressing himself does. He is a very observant artist, deep thinking and with unsurpassed joy as storyteller he fascinates one from the first encounter, catches you with his exciting stories from the world of myths and his imaginative and beautiful sculptures visualize and underlines stories.

Although his thoughts for his works derive from former times and originate from old myths he is able to link stories from the mythology with the present and suddenly the content gives another understanding, a more tangible reality; as in his little story about the tree pixie sitting in the old tree root, bemoaning the stupidity of man and the way they treat nature, clutching the last small seed, so that he can plant the seed when man has ruined all and rebuild the world.

Michael Sasserson is a very exciting and present artist and one can feel his deep and sincere urge to create and tell. A strong fire burns within him and he works consistently from the idea, the thought, and story behind the structure to form a whole and expression in the finished configuration. He has a Vikings brute force and primordial power, but with his sensitivity and love hidden in his breast. Precisely these antipoles he can oppose and unite in his sculptures so the story and the expression stand forceful and strong, but the impression we get is aesthetic and sensitive.

Michael's beautiful sculptures and moving stories intoxicates and one just wants to see and experience more and be engulfed by more magical stories from the world of the Gods.



Delightfully out of control!







I am mixing it all to fantasy landscapes, unknown worlds, utopian mountains with cathedrals of nature".



For the scenes, of this series of paintings "Just before", Tym Andersen was inspired by his real, everyday life on Fyn – well as real as reality can be:

The neighbouring house in Odense is threatened by a plane off route. The floating car stares its destiny in the eyes at Fyns Hoved. The boy with his pole is about to hit the surface. The cyclist in Kerteminde is facing a hard reception on the pavement of Vestergade. A senior citizen realizes too late, that he is standing on a bike lane in Odense. On Odense Kanal four rowers are about to meet their superior. In the hills of Hindsholmvej the driver of a sports car makes the mistake of a lifetime. The feeling on the porch is about to get a bit too warm. On the road to Dalby the driver has no chance of avoiding the deer. – It all happens in just a minute from now.

As a portrait artist, I'm intrigued by showing the person interacting with his environment, in the middle of doing something. My children's portraits strive to be a depiction of a child reacting to an experience, rather than just sitting still.








Sophy Bostholm

Especially Greece has my interest as I spend a couple of months on the island of Folegandros each year.









When you enter the room a orgy of rich colors meets you. The stories pour out of the frames and make you smile through a cornucopia of details which is a pleasure to explore. That it is not frisky and naive Henning Severin Pedersen brings forward in a wonderful subtle way. A painting such as "And then he grew", has a strange danger, which partly shows in the man's distorted, tormented face and partly through the background, ornamented with a dualism between hearts and flies.



This led to a more artistic figure painting, which has been practiced in Denmark both before and after COBRA.



Art Under Water: Merging Danish under-water photography and Rwandan art

What happens when you ask five talented Rwandan artists to paint on a canvas of under-water photographies? That is what Lars Hestbæk, a Danish under-water photographer and artist was visiting Rwanda to find out.

Working together with five talented young Rwandan artists for three weeks, Lars Hestbæk aimed to merge different cultures and art forms: Photography and painting, Rwanda and Denmark. The result is something you don't want to miss!

The idea of the project was to challenge artists in Rwanda to exploit their potential and be inspired to do their own thing. Making good artists requires willingness to invest in them, providing them trainings and a good framework for them to develop, take chances and risk to fail in order to succeed.

Merging two artforms in Rwanda in just a three-week period has been challenging and the work intensity has been extremely high. The project has taking a lot of new directions and the cultural meeting between Photographer Lars Hestbæk and the booming art scene in Rwanda has just begun and will evolve in the near future.



Lives in one of the hardcore areas in Kigali and makes his living making pieces for bars and stores in the area.












It means a lot to me, to give the intensity that I see to the viewer, and try to give them the same feeling and experience as I had when I took the photo.







A Case of Wall Breaking Art

When Danish artist Nadia Plesner moved to Amsterdam in 2006 to study Fine Arts at the Gerrit Rietveld Academy she could not possibly have imagined the following six years. A severe traffic accident changed all her plans and subsequently led to the drawing Simple Living, which portrays a naked Darfurian child holding fashionable dog and a large designer bag. Plesner made the drawing as a comment on the media's prioritisation between the genocide in Darfur and celebrity "news" making the front page. Plesner had the drawing printed on T-shirts and posters to raise money for the organization "Divest for Darfur".

When Louis Vuitton sued her and demanded million sized penalties because of the drawn bag, both the case and Darfur received massive media attention world wide.

Unable to pay the penalties, Plesner stopped selling the t-shirts and instead she returned 1,5 years later with the oil painting Darfurnica, a modern version of Picasso's Guernica. The painting led to a new court case with Louis Vuitton yet this time Plesner chose to fight.

She won the case in The Hague in May 2011 and is now free to exhibit both Simple Living and Darfurnica.

In her speech Plesner tells about the case, her art and about her foundation The Simple Living Committee, which ships containers with school equipment and medical equipment to various developing countries.

The mid section of the painting with the gloomy colors recounts Doomsday and the last section of the painting shows the new world by bright, clear colors,- the new world has come and will last for a thousand years, without sorrow, illness or death.



Marina Abramovic: The artist is present

Face to face with the world's greatest performance artist in the biggest show of her life.

Is it radical to sit on a chair and stare into space? And is this art? Yes it is if you do it eight hours a day, six days a week, and three months in a row. And this was exactly what the sixty three year old art star and performance pioneer Marina Abramovic did in her career defining solo show "The Artist is Present" at MoMA i New York. A simple but extreme gesture based on eye contact with each and every one of the almost one million people who visited the exhibition. Marina Abramovic has throughout the forty years as a performing artist had a gun to her head by an onlooker, set fire to herself, and walked on the Chinese Wall to meet her sweetheart in a long and painful farewell ritual. By consistently taking the point of departure in her own body Abramovic creates seductive, confronting and often lethal performances, dancing on the edge of a knife between catharsis and self torture. But nothing can compare with the magnum opus which we follow backstage from idea till the last, intense minutes; an elegant offer on this year's great art film, also for those to whom Abramovic is a new name.

The film is shown Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday at 5:30 PM.

Holy Motors by Leo Carax

Freedom. The right to do as you want. The right to do completely as you feel, you are in your right to do. The urge not to give a shit about anyone or anything and the whole film industry. This is what reviewer Per Juul Carlsen says about this masterpiece of a film. "Holy Motors" starts with a sequence where the instructor himself wakes up in a hotel room, opens a secret door in the wall and steps into a cinema where people seem dead. Then he scatters a row of scenes. It could be ten to twelve scenes from miscellaneous films but Leo Carax glues them together in a red thread in the form of a man, Monsieur Oscar, who drives through Paris in a long white limousine and changes clothes and identity before he steps out of the car in order to play the main role in a film scene. He is only at work as he underlines several times. All in all there is a whole world of filmic freedom in Holy Motors. It is as if the film art is stripped away and reborn.
